Spring Flood Damage Repaired

Once again, the 'big bend' area of Turtle Creek between Saunders Station Road and Trafford suffered from flash floods during the heavy spring rain events we experienced this year. Flood waters washed away 600 feet of the trail's limestone topcoat but luckily did not remove the underlying base layer of asphalt millings that were put in place after last year's flood.

Damage repair was done by EverReady Contracting, located near the trail in Trafford. The contractor did a good job, and even removed a large tree from a drain. Limestone dust was rolled on top and packed down after a few light rain events, so the trail is now in good shape.

The Westmoreland Heritage Trail is managed by the Westmoreland Heritage Trail Chapter of the Regional Trail Corporation, a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization. Eight municipal partners (Trafford, Monroeville, Penn Township, Murrysville, Export, Delmont, Salem Township, and Loyalhanna Township) work with over 300 active chapter volunteers to maintain and monitor the trail. Other trail partners include the Westmoreland County Bureau of Parks & Recreation and the Westmoreland Conservation District.



Another Successful Poker Run & Community Festival!

Murrysville was the trail town selected this year for our Annual Poker Run and Community Festival Fundraiser. As in years past, the event was held on June 1 to coincide with <u>National Trails Day</u>. The Murrysville Community Center near the Carson-Braun trailhead made a convenient registration point, with walkers and bike-riders heading east toward Export to collect their poker hands.





Early June weekends are packed with competing events, but our Poker Run was fortunate to receive lots of advertising. Generous support from the Penn-Franklin News enabled us to place flyers in local papers. Additional support provided by Penneco Outdoor Advertising allowed us to place an advertisement on the large electronic billboard along Route 22 in Delmont.

In all, fifty-three participants pre-registered for the Poker Run, and another thirty-six signed up on the day of the event to make a sizable group of bikers and walkers. Food was provided by Salsa Sam's and Millie's Ice Cream, beer by Helltown Beer Company and other beverages (Turner's tea and lemonade) courtesy of Slickville Deli.







Each participant in the race received a commemorative t-shirt with the WHT Poker Run logo on the front and the race sponsors listed on the back (see next page).



Many beautiful baskets and gift certificates were donated for the auction basket raffle, which was popular with race participants and their family members alike. The top three Poker Hands won prizes donated by Pro Bike and Run, Trafford Shop & Save, and Pristine Clean Auto Detailing. Many thanks go out to Ann Wade, who chaired the event, Malcolm Sias, who served as the master of ceremonies, and all of the dedicated volunteers who staffed the registration and poker hand tables!

News from Other Trails - Five Star Trail Poker Run

The annual Five Star Trail Poker Run will be held on **Saturday, July 20, 2024** starting at Lynch Field in Greensburg. Registration begins at 8:00 am and the event will start at 9:00 am. The registration fee is \$25 for pre-registered participants; day-of registration is \$30. <u>Click here to download a registration form</u>.

Like the WHT Poker Run, the Five Star Trail's Poker Run is not a race. Participants can choose a 4-mile walk or a 12 -mile bike ride; or adjust the distance according to your needs. Participants will choose a playing card from a deck of cards at each of 5 checkpoints along the trail. Upon finishing the event, each participant will have assembled a full poker hand. The top 3 poker hands will get a trophy and a special prize package.

If you've never visited <u>our sister trail in</u> <u>Greensburg</u>, it runs from Lynch Field Park north of Greensburg down to Youngwood and Armbrust.

The Five Star Trail shares part of its route with an active railroad line, the Southwestern Pennsylvania Railroad corridor. Trails that operate next to active railroads are an unusual circumstance, and only a few exist in Pennsylvania. The Five Star Trail has been a success since opening in 1996, and their lease agreement with the Southwestern Pennsylvania Railroad has been renewed through 2045. The mission of the Westmoreland Heritage Trail is to manage and maintain the trail from Saltsburg to Trafford, in partnership with like-minded groups, Westmoreland County Parks, and the associated municipalities the trail passes through. The trail will be promoted for walking and biking activities and for recreation, education, volunteerism, tourism, and historic and environmental conservation.
