



WINTER TRAIL NOTES



Two portable rest facilities will stay open along the Westmoreland Heritage Trail this winter - one at the Saunders Station trailhead and the other at the Sara Steel trailhead. The Roberts Parcel restrooms in Murrysville will also be open and those at the Export Historical Society Visitor's Center are scheduled to open from 7 AM to 7 PM on winter weekends.

We are often asked why we do not groom our trails during the winter, as some other trails do in higher elevation areas. The Westmoreland Heritage Trail is a group made up entirely of volunteers and keeping the trail in great shape is our top priority. However, our normal winters in Westmoreland County involve a lot of freeze-thaw cycles and the condition of the snow (often slush) would be a constant maintenance need. Any snowgrooming equipment might actually end up damaging the trail's limestone surface for the rest of the year.

We also know that our trail users appreciate the serenity of a quiet winter trail, and would prefer as little disruption as possible. The constant need to groom for winter maintenance might end up irritating our trail users more than it would benefit them.




2024—A RECORD-BREAKING YEAR FOR WHT FUNDRAISING!

Donations and grants received by the Westmoreland Heritage Trail chapter in 2024 totaled \$17,950, almost four times more than the donations contributed in 2023. This includes Corporate Sponsorships, memorial donations for Noel Grimm, and charitable donations made by our trail chapter members, regional benefactors, and several small community foundations. Thanks to all of our amazing supporters!

In addition to donations and grants, trail fundraising events added \$6,247 from Comedy Night in 2024, \$7,046 from the 2024 Trail Town Festival and Poker Run, \$2,759 from the 2024 Ted Hayes Memorial Run-Bike-Walk, and \$550 donated by the Export Witches Ride in 2024, for a grand fundraising total of \$34,552.

Many thanks to all of our trail chapter members and volunteers who generously donated the time, labor and support to make this accomplishment possible!





VOLUNTEER WITH THE WESTMORELAND HERITAGE TRAIL!

We welcome volunteers to join us in maintaining and supporting the trail, no matter what season of the year it is. Your volunteer hours also count as an in-kind donation, making the trail eligible for higher levels of grant funding because we can show that we have 'matched' the cash award with many donated hours of labor.

News from Other Trails - Friends of the Riverfront



The Turtle Creek Connector is a new bicycle and pedestrian route proposed by the Pennsylvania Environmental Council (PEC) along with the nonprofit Friends of the Riverfront. This trail would start at the west end of the Westmoreland Heritage Trail (WHT) in Trafford, PA and then continue down through the Turtle Creek / East Pittsburgh Valley to the historic Carrie Furnace in Rankin, PA where it would cross the Monongahela River and join up with the Great Allegheny Passage (GAP) Trail.

The western part of the Turtle Creek Connector will need to be a shared-use trail, utilizing existing streets and sidewalks. This is because the original Westinghouse Interworks line that once ran through this area has been replaced by buildings and roadways. From Wilmerding to Trafford, the unused Westinghouse Interworks line is still available to be converted to a trail, if the right-of-way can be purchased from Norfolk



Southern Railway. This purchase would include the rail line that runs from the Westmoreland Heritage Trail west of BY Park into downtown Trafford.

As PEC continues to work on the design and funding of the Turtle Creek Connector, municipal officials in Pitcairn have started planning for it as well. The borough will use the first part of a \$255,000 state grant to improve parking and create a walking path near their Sports Complex, which should connect to the new trail. Pitcairn officials say they are hoping to follow the same model as Export in Westmoreland County, which has taken advantage of the Westmoreland Heritage Trail to revitalize their downtown and bring more foot traffic to their business community.

Also included are the Five Star Trail Chapter, the Coal and Coke Trail Chapter, the Little Crabtree Creek Trail Chapter and the St. Vincent Trail Chapter.
