

The Westmoreland Heritage Trail is managed by the Westmoreland Heritage Trail Chapter of the Regional Trail Corporation, a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization. Eight municipal partners (Trafford, Monroeville, Penn Township, Murrysville, Export, Delmont, Salem Township, and Loyalhanna Township) work with over 400 active chapter volunteers to maintain and monitor the trail. Other trail partners include the Westmoreland County Bureau of Parks & Recreation and the Westmoreland Conservation District.



Property Acquired for Future Route 66 Tunnel and Trailhead

At the end of March, the Regional Trail Corporation signed a purchase agreement for a 2.66 acre parcel at the intersection of Route 66 and Industrial Drive north of Delmont. This site was under development to become a Dollar General store, but those plans fell through late last year. The property was then offered to the RTC to help fill in the missing 'middle gap' of the Westmoreland Heritage Trail. Funds for the purchase were contributed by the Regional Trail Corporation, the Westmoreland Heritage Trail Chapter, the Westmoreland Land Trust, and an anonymous donor.

the left, a smaller 'bite' of land had originally been divided off from the main parcel to give the Westmoreland Heritage Trail future access along Industrial Drive. Owning the entire parcel here opens up the possibility of creating an easily accessible trail head with a large parking lot, as well as the space to build a maintenance and storage building. This is a goal that our trail volunteers have been fundraising for over the past decade. We are thrilled to finally have a site identified for its placement.

Before it becomes a trail head, the new parcel will first provide a critical 'lay-down' area for the large amount of construction equipment and supplies needed to build a new trail tunnel beneath Route 66. This is an ideal spot, close to where the original Turtle Creek Railroad line once ran from Ringertown on the west to Athena Drive on the east. Grant funds have already been secured for the design of this tunnel as well as its adjacent trail sections on either side of Route 66 (see proposed site map below).

With ownership of the Route 66 parcel now secured, Delmont Borough can also begin planning and development work for an additional spur trail that will connect the downtown business district with the Westmoreland Heritage Trail. While actual construction of the tunnel and trail is still years away, the WHT would like to send our sincere thanks to the staff of Westmoreland County Bureau of Parks and Recreation, the Regional Trail Corporation, and to Richard Kacin and Delmont Builders Supply for making this 'middle gap miracle' happen!

Bring your bike and join staff from the Westmoreland Conservation District (WCD) on this easy, 7 mile (round trip) ride. Bikers will stop at multiple sites to hear about conservation and restoration projects along the trail and learn about local history.
